

# Tisbury Parish Council – Minutes of the Ordinary Parish Council Meeting Held at 7.00 pm on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> December 2023 in the Reading Room, High Street, TISBURY, SP3 6LD

# Questions or Statements:

Two members of the public spoke in objection to the planning application PL/2023/10016.

**Wiltshire Councillor Report:** Wiltshire Councillor Richard Budden gave a detailed on a number of issues, the key points of which were as follows:

**South West Wiltshire Area Board:** The meeting held in East Knoyle on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> November was largely focused on highways matters. It was very well attended. A presentation was given jointly by Caroline Thomas, the Cabinet Member for Highways, Samantha Howell, Director of Highways and Dave Thomas, Head of Highways Asset Management & Commissioning advising that more money was to be allocated to highways improvements in 2024 and 2025 but that central government funding for the last few years had remained static whilst costs had gone up and inflation in the infrastructure sector was running at 16 percent.

There was also a presentation given by John Derryman, Head of Strategy, Performance and Oversight, for the Office the Police and Crime Commissioner. In summary, he said that there has been a significant improvement in enforcement with just 250 tickets being issued in the year to November 2022 and over 8,000 this year by November 2023.

# 139.23 Apologies

#### 142.23 Planning and Tree Works Applications \*Clerk

**PL/2023/10016 Variety Barn, Hindon Lane, Tisbury -** Demolition of existing barn and erection of dwelling, reuse of existing stone, landscaping and ecology enhancements, solar array, field shelter and associated works:

- **Resolved: RAB/RB**; unanimous: To **object** to the application on the grounds that it will result in the loss of a Non-Designated Heritage Asset, the size and design of the proposed dwelling, the impact on the Cranborne Chase International Dark Sky Reserve, the impact of the solar array on the National Landscape (formerly AONB) and the limited access to the site:
  - **a.** The proposal is contrary to Policy 57 of the Wiltshire Core Strategy as the proposal is to demolish the NDHA which will result in a loss of a building of heritage value to the historic environment and to the character of the surrounding area within the National Landscape.
  - **b.** The size, scale and design of the dwelling does not make a positive contribution to its landscape setting or to the character of the area and is therefore contrary to Policy 58 of the Wiltshire Core Strategy.
  - **c.** No mitigation is provided for the extensive light pollution which will be caused by the significant amount of glass in the large windows, full length glass doors and the glass connecting section proposed to connect one part of the dwelling to the other. This will have significant impact on the National Landscape which has International Dark Sky Reserve status.
  - **d.** The scale of the solar array will impact on the National Landscape and on the visual amenity of the neighbouring properties. It will also be clearly visible from the public footpaths which are close to the site, TISB02 and TISB58, as well as footpath TISB08 which runs along on the other side of the Fonthill Brook valley.
  - e. The access track to the site is narrow and inadequate for the extent of the work to be undertaken in this proposal and the visibility onto Hindon Lane is limited and may cause accidents if a wider visibility splay is not provided.

# PL/2023/09939 8 Fonthill Cottages, Hindon Lane, Tisbury - Following

consultations with two arborists, crowning work to reduce volume by approx. 50% is required to an oversize Siberian Crab apple tree, which is within very close proximity to the house:

- Resolved: to leave the decision to the Tree Officer; NE/RB; unanimous

# **139.23 Planning Application Decisions**

Councillors noted the following decisions on recent applications:

- PL/2023/09002 Court Street, Tisbury X 3 Lime, Tag No 190, 191, 193, prune to below knuckles to promote new, healthy growth of pollarded shoots. Pruned branches have become decayed and unsafe to prune to the usual extent. X 8 stools of Alder, marked with orange paint, Fell. Within area of planned development reference 15/11990/FUL Condition 4. No replacement as development will take over this space. X 2 Ash trees, marked with orange paint, Fell. Within area of planned development reference 15/11990/FUL Condition 4 and early signs of ash dieback. No replacement as development will take over this space No objection and In line with the Parish Council's recommendations.
- b. PL/2023/098915 The Old Grain Store, Pouldens Farm, Tisbury Prior Approval Agricultural buildings to flexible commercial use – Prior approval granted. This application did not go to consultation.
- c. PL/2023/08442 Tisbury Fire Station, The Avenue, Tisbury G3 Lime x 4(T2, T6, T7, T9) Remove sucker and epicormic growth from base to a height of 2.5m. Crown lift pendulous branches over parking areas to a height of 2.5m. T-12 Lime Reduce spread over building up to 2.5m. Crown lift all around to 2m above grass height Approve with conditions. This application was not considered by the Parish Council.

# 141.23 Warm Spaces Initiative and Winter Coffee Concession at the Nadder Centre

To consider a report from the Clerk and a proposal from Councillor Davison to support Wiltshire Council's winter Warm Spaces Initiative at the Nadder Centre through the Parish Council's partial funding of an on-site Coffee Concession for a period of 3 months:

- **Approved; SD/NE;** unanimous; that a £700 per month contribution be made for a limited period of 3 months to Coffee Angels. Wiltshire Council had confirmed that prior to the concession being set up it would carry out a TQF tender with identified providers in the market place, including Coffee Angels, to see if they wished to to submit quotes for the concession.
